

## English II Pre-AP Summer Reading Assignment

Students will choose **ONE** of the following novels to read in preparation for the English II PAP. In addition to **one** of the novels below, PAP students will read *Animal Farm* by George Orwell. You must purchase unmarked copies of these novels.

*Pride and Prejudice* – Jane Austen ISBN# 978-0141439518  
*Kidnapped* – Robert Louis Stevenson ISBN# 978-0141441795

Assignments for the novels include:

1. **READ AND ANNOTATE :**

- plot development – include setting with notes as to its effect,
- literary devices/techniques (symbolism, foreshadowing, imagery, characterization, point of view, irony, etc.)
- theme

2. **WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT #1:**

Write a 300 – 350 word response to **each** of the following. Each response will be typed on a separate page and printed out to be turned in on the assigned date. You will be required to follow MLA format - Times New Roman 12 font, double spaced, and correct heading and format – on each of the paragraphs. Grammar, as well as format, will be graded on this assignment. **REMEMBER THIS IS TO BE YOUR WORK AND NOT THAT FROM OTHER SOURCES AND IS NOT CONSIDERED A GROUP PROJECT. SUCH WORK WILL RECEIVE A GRADE OF 0.**

- Describe the protagonist and antagonist, the setting, and the central plot and subplots of the novel. What is the major conflict of the novel? What type of conflict is it? How does the protagonist overcome or reconcile this conflict? Use quotes to support making sure that all quotes are integrated and documented.
- What is a main theme of the novel? Write a clear thematic statement for this novel. Using direct quotes or evidence from the novel, discuss how the author develops this theme.
- Select 3 key quotes from the novel and explain the significance of each to the work as a whole. In this journal, you may state the direct quote and then in complete sentences, discuss the significance of this quote.
- What is an important “life lesson” that you learned from reading the novel? In other words, what is something meaningful that you learned from the novel that might impact your life in some way.

2. **ASSIGNMENT #2: *Animal Farm* ISBN#978-0451526342**

- Before you begin reading the novel, *Animal Farm*, watch the following presentations. Take notes, which you will turn in the first week of class. Make sure to read these carefully, as they will develop a better understanding of the significance of this novel.

- Watch the following introduction to the novel which will discuss how the novel is an allegory. As you watch the video, create a list of animals, locations, and events that are used as symbols. As you read the speech by Old Major in Chapter One of the novel, annotate elements of the speech that show how he uses language and structure to persuade the animals to help him create a utopia on Manor Farm. In a response journal of 300 – 350 words, use specific evidence – direct quotes and citations – to how Old Major convinces the animals to be a part of the rebellion. Remember – I want your ideas. **Responses taking from other sources will be given a grade of 0. I want you to think on this one.**

You will turn in your annotated novel and take a 50 question objective test over the reading assignment *Pride and Prejudice or Kidnapped* on Wednesday, 8/22 or Thursday, 8/23.
