## THE ACADEMY'S BIBLICAL POSITION ON THE TEACHER AS A ROLE MODEL

First Baptist Academy uses only the <u>Bible</u> as its basis for faith and practice (II Timothy 3: 16-17) and all employees are required to be born again, to be active in an evangelical church, and to live lives pleasing to Christ as Lord (Colossians 3:17).

As an educational institution, the Academy requires that every employee manifests by precept and example the highest Christian virtue and personal decorum, serve as a <u>role model</u> to pupils (I Timothy 4:12) both in and out of school (Luke 6:40), and as an example to parents and fellow faculty members in judgment, respect, and Christian living. This includes, but is not limited to, the refraining from such activities as the use of alcohol, tobacco, illicit drugs, and the use of vulgar and profane language (Colossians 3:17; Titus 2: 7-8; I Thessalonians 2:10, 5:18, 22; James 3:17-18).

The Academy employee agrees that the Scripture dictates standards of sexual behavior. Any promiscuity, homosexuality, or other deviant sexual behavior is forbidden and such violates the requirement of being a <u>role model</u>. The unique roles of male and female are clearly defined in Scripture. Romans 1:24-32 states that God recognized homosexuals and other deviates as perverted. Such deviation from Scriptural standards is grounds for termination (Romans 12: 1-2; I Corinthians 6: 9-20; Ephesians 4: 1-11, 5: 3-5; I Thessalonians 4: 3-8; I Timothy 4:12; II Timothy 2: 19-22; I Peter 1: 15-16; I John 3: 1-3).
